


# ENGINEERING CLASS OF '55 45th REUNION 2000

### **ENGINEERING CLASS OF 1955 BURSARY**

### Introduction

At the time of our 40<sup>th</sup> Reunion in 1995, as a project, we solicited funds from classmates for a bursary in the Faculty of Engineering; the bursary would carry the name of our class. As of December 31, 1995 the amount of \$8,573 had been pledged, and there were subsequent pledges of \$710. The money was left to earn interest until at the beginning of September 2000, an amount of approximately \$11,400 was available for bursary purposes. This would generate a bursary of about \$500 or so, as at the University now, 5% of the capital available is the annual amount of an award. Your Reunion Committee 2000 sought the advice of the University Financial Aid and Awards Office and the Faculty of Engineering Scholarships, Bursaries and Awards Committee as regards where the award would confer the maximum benefit. Based on the advice received, a proposal under the title of "Engineering Class of 1955 Bursary" was made to the Senate of the University with the terms of reference as given below. Grant Sims was named as the contact person from our class. The Senate passed the proposal at its meeting on November 1, 2000 and an award of \$500 was made to a deserving Engineering student in December 2000.

### Terms of Reference

On the occasion of the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of graduation from the University of Manitoba, the Engineering Class of 1955 has established a fund to support a bursary for an Engineering student. Each year (starting in the winter of 2000), a bursary valued at the available annual income from the fund (initially \$500) shall be offered to a student who:

- (1) has completed at least one year of full-time study at the University of Manitoba, either in University I or in the Faculty of Engineering:
- (2) has achieved a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5:
- (3) is enrolled as a full-time student in the Faculty of Engineering in any department and in any year of the program;
- (4) has demonstrated financial need on the standard University of Manitoba bursary application form

The selection committee shall be the Scholarships, Bursaries and Awards Committee of the Faculty of Engineering.

### Request for Further Donations

An amount of \$500 doesn't go very far these days. Funds are available at April 1, 2001 to match our contributions dollar-for-dollar. Hence your Committee encourages you to consider a generous contribution to expand this Bursary Fund; details are in the covering letter sent with this report. **NOTE** that a cheque should be dated **April 1, 2001** or later, but do deal with it **NOW**, as the matching funds are only available for a limited time.
